

A Description of Etchingam Forge 1597

The Forge house in great decaye wherein ys one Hammer, Weelde, Beam Hamer and Anvile with all the harnys belonginge to yt, one Chaferye wheele and the beame one payre of large bellows and their Attyre, And twoe fynerie Beames and wheeles with twoe payre of large bellows wth their Attyre with all necessarie ymplements and Toolles fitt and necessarie for the Forge with ponde conteyninge xxxv acres Twoe Fluddgates and one watercourse, twoe Iron houses walled with bordes, wth a wast piece of grownde for the placinge of Coles, Sewer [Sowes?], Tymber and other necessaries for the Forge conteyninge one Acre
